Little Brothers - Friends of the Elderly is a national network of non-profit, volunteer-based organizations committed to relieving isolation and loneliness among the elderly.

We offer to people of good will the opportunity to join the elderly in friendship and celebration of life.

Providing Safe and Reliable Medical Transportation

Most of our elderly friends no longer drive and find it difficult to find affordable transportation to their medical appointments. Through our Medical Transportation Program, we provide *door-through-door transportation* free of charge. We are always in need of volunteers to provide transportation with your own vehicle or with one of our wheelchair accessible vans (training will be provided.)

To ensure we provide safe and reliable transportation for our elderly friends, here are some helpful guidelines.....

- "Door-through-Door" transportation means we ask you to provide stand-by assistance
 for the passenger to and from the car and through the door of the home or office. If
 you feel uncomfortable providing this assistance, we ask you refrain from providing
 transport.
- Call your passenger at least 24 hours before their appointment to inform them you will be their driver.
- If you have to cancel, please inform the Transportation Coordinator who will find another driver and inform the passenger.
- If you arrange to drive the passenger to their next appointment, you must inform the coordinator for our record keeping.
- Please inform the coordinator if the passenger needs additional assistance in the future. For example, the passenger who was once ambulatory now requires wheelchair transport.
- Please allocate approximately 3 hours of your time for each transport.
- Please call Michelle, the Transportation Coordinator at 482-6944 with any questions.

Little Brothers first started an informal food pantry so elderly friends could stop by and pick up a few items as needed. The demand for food pantry assistance has grown over the years and we now distribute nearly 100 bags of food per month.

Marian Martin has taken charge of stocking the shelves and filling the bags for over 12 years but she recently informed us she and her husband John are moving to Kentucky to live closer to family.

She didn't just ensure our elderly friends received a bag of food each month, she would get to know them and their needs to personalize each bag based on the recipient's dietary restrictions and food preferences.

Marian had faithful volunteers to help fill the bags each month including Joanne Edwards, Angie Hamilton, Glenn Ierley, Faye Marion, John Martin, Tom Oldfield, and Sue Wiles.

Glenn Ierley is a fairly new volunteer who started by dropping off donations of food for the pantry and slowly became more involved. Glenn is a retired professor of mathematics. He taught for 10 years at MTU before moving to San Diego where he finished his career. He returned to the Copper Country upon retirement.

When Glenn learned of Marian's departure, he agreed to take charge of the food distribution.

He is currently learning the process and looking for ways to streamline it to "get more food to more people" and to better meet their needs.

Glenn volunteers with us because now that he's retired, he has more time and wants to use his skills for a good cause.

We want to thank Marian and John for their dedication to the Food Pantry and thank Glenn for taking charge of the next chapter.

Regional Medical Transport Gets Triple Boost! In April 2015, we received terrific The Superior Health news: Foundation out of Marquette and the Portage Health Foundation out of Hancock agreed to match each other's contributions to help us expand our regional medical transportation program! program helps transport our elderly friends from Houghton County to Marquette or Baraga County for specialty medical visits. The service is crucially needed but costly to operate, as it requires more staff time, fuel, and ties up a van for an entire day. With the jointly-funded grant of \$43,500, Little Brothers committed to raising additional \$21,850 of cash and in -kind resources. We are hitting the ground running and have already purchased a speciallyequipped wheelchair van. Look for our bright red Dodge Caravan Thanks Superior and Portage for making our dream of regional medical transportation a reality for our elderly friends who depend on us. You have helped us help our elderly friends live healthier, happier, and more independent lives!



Baraga County Community
Foundation: Many of our elderly
friends in Baraga County have
difficulty finding transportation to
their medical appointments in
Houghton County. In April of
2015, we received a generous
grant of \$720 from the Baraga
County Community Foundation
which will help defray the costs of
conducting 40-50 medical
transports for our elderly friends
who live a little further afield.
