EASTER SUNDAY VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

Easter volunteer jobs:

<u>KITCHEN FOOD PREP/COOK</u>: A food safety certified lead cook will provide direction during the meal prep and cooking as you help to prepare the traditional holiday meal. Volunteers must be 13 years or older to work in kitchen.

<u>KITCHEN FOOD LINE/CLEAN UP</u>: The **kitchen lead** will oversee the volunteers while plating or packaging up the food. Volunteers are encouraged to sit, eat, and visit with the elders during the meal. The **kitchen clean up lead** will assign jobs for the clean up to ensure that all the dishes, kitchen surfaces and floors are cleaned to health department standards.

<u>DINING ROOM SET UP/SERVE</u>: The **dining room lead** will direct volunteers to set up the dining room and tables in a festive manner. The volunteers then help to serve drinks/meals to seated guests and sit down to enjoy the holiday meal with them.



<u>DINING ROOM SERVE/CLEAN UP</u>: Volunteers assist with serving meals to seated guests and sit to enjoy a meal and conversation with the elders. The **Dining room lead** will assign volunteer tasks to clean and sanitize the dining area that include clearing tables, sweeping, mopping, and vacuuming.

<u>DISTRIBUTION SET UP/PACKAGE MEALS</u>: The **distribution lead** will direct volunteers to help set up, prepare and package the meals into the individual delivery bags that will be picked up by meal delivery volunteers.



<u>**MEAL DELIVERY</u>**: The Distribution lead will assign the meals for volunteer drivers to deliver. Volunteers are encouraged to visit for a short while if the elder is receptive to company.</u>

TRANSPORT ELDERS: Volunteers will be assigned to pickup elderly guests at their home and drive them to the meal site. Volunteers are encouraged to eat and visit with their passenger and then provide the elder a ride home.

<u>ENTERTAINMENT</u>: Provide musical entertainment at our sit-down meal sites before and after the meal. Volunteers are encouraged to eat and visit with the elders during the meal.
